Implant Restorations, All the Small Things

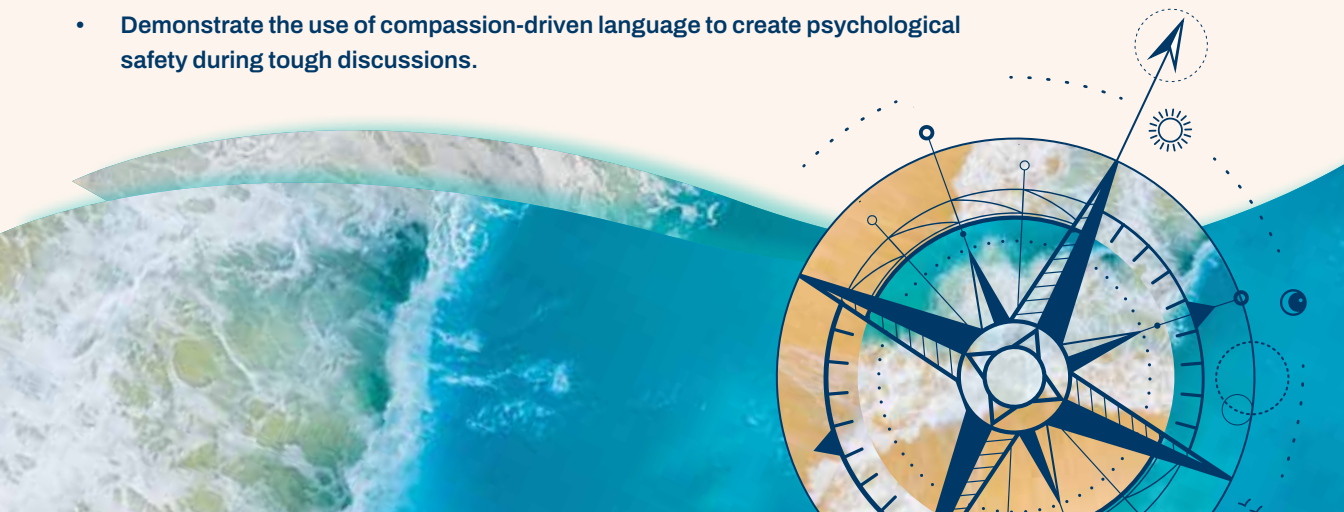


Crucial Conversations & Conflict Resolution

Based on the CORE Framework, this workshop helps dental professionals navigate high-stakes conversations with clarity and care. From giving feedback to handling performance issues, participants will learn how to manage their emotions, avoid common pitfalls, and address tough topics with courage and compassion.

- Preparing your patient for potential issues.



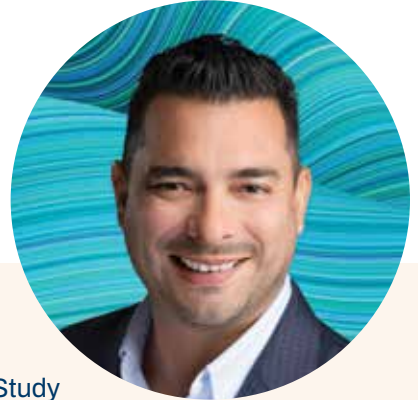

Rooting Out New Evidence-based Antibiotic Guidance That Every Dentist Should Know

This program introduces five actionable dental antibiotic prescribing practices, grounded in the latest dental literature. The curriculum challenges traditional approaches to prophylactic antibiotics for joint implant patients, managing penicillin allergies, alternatives to clindamycin, shorter antibiotic courses and evidence-based decision making. The program includes a 1.5-hour lecture on current guidelines and research followed by an interactive session applying these new practices in daily clinical scenarios. By the end, participants will be prepared to make informed evidence-based antibiotic decisions that improve patient safety and reduce legal risks.

Learning Objectives:

- Apply the American Academy of Orthopedic Surgeons (Nov 2024) Evidence-based Guideline on dental antibiotic prophylaxis for joint implant patients.
- Challenge the traditional “dental antibiotic dogma” of 7 and 10 days duration of therapy, the recommendation to “finish the course” and clindamycin for penicillin allergic patients.

The Art of “Strategic Compromise” in Complex Rehabilitations

In an academic setting, the solution to a complex rehabilitation often involves a “Golden Triad” of orthodontics, periodontics and prosthodontics. However, in private practice, the “Ideal Plan” frequently collides with the patient’s limitations regarding finances, time, or surgical willingness. This lecture addresses the most common challenge dentists face: How to deliver a stable, functional, and esthetic result when the patient declines the necessary prerequisites. We will explore the art of “Strategic Compromise”, identifying which deviations from the ideal are acceptable and which pose a threat to longevity. The goal is to provide clinicians with protocols for “Real-World Dentistry,” ensuring that fitting the treatment to the patient’s resources does not mean sacrificing the stability of the final outcome.

Learning Objectives:

- Differentiate between “Compromised Treatment” and “Substandard Treatment” establishing clear ethical boundaries for when to accept a case and when to refer or decline.
- Master restorative compensation techniques.
- Formulate a “Staged Treatment Planning” protocol that presents the patient with the Ideal Option and a Pragmatic Alternative.

Dr. Luis Boza / Director

Dr. Boza joins us from the land of the “Pura Vida” or “Pure Life,” Costa Rica. Here, he got his DDS certificate in 2004 and practiced for five years in both government and private practice. He dedicated most of his time in private practice to “Dental Tourism,” making full mouth rehabilitations, including implant reconstructions. He then decided to specialize in prosthodontics and went on to Rochester, New York where he did three years of specialty training and a one-year fellowship in implant dentistry, including placement and rehabilitation of implants, at Eastman Institute for Oral Health. After this, he was recruited to teach prosthetics and cosmetics at the University of Iowa Dental School in Iowa City. There, he was a resolute professor of future dentists focused on the science of making dentures and crowns, clinically and in a laboratory.

He also has an MBA specialized in Medical Business Administration from Universidad de Santa Paula, Costa Rica. While still in Costa Rica, he created a non-profit association, Project Talamanca, alongside other local dentists. This organization provided free dental services to the Indigenous community of Talamanca.

In his leisure time, he likes to play sports, even though he admits he is not great at any. He especially enjoys soccer, street and mountain biking, volleyball and tennis. Reading Sci-fi novels is a new pastime of his, but he enjoys letting his imagination wander. He considers himself to be an amateur chef and a foodie.

Dr. Garine graduated from Cairo University School of Dentistry in Egypt. Dr. Garine joined the Dental School at the University of Western in London, Ontario, where he earned his dental degree.

Graduating first in his class, Dr. Garine received the Dr. Gerald Z. Wright Award for excellence. He then joined the Eastman Dental Center at the University of Rochester, in NY where he spent three years specializing in the area of Prosthodontics.

Dr. Garine spent the following year teaching at the University of Rochester and completed the Implant Fellowship, for which he received the Dr. Gerald N. Graser Fellowship Award. Dr. Garine's research in implant dentistry has received several awards and was published in the International Journal of Oral and Maxillofacial Implants.

Dr. Garine is the Director of the Seaside Study Club (local chapter of the Seattle Study Club in Jupiter, FL), a clinical assistant professor at the University of Rochester, NY, and an adjunct clinical assistant professor at the University of Oklahoma.

With over 150 publications, numerous research grants, and frequent keynote appearances—including at the 2026 Seattle Study Club national conference.

Dr. Tal Morr maintains a private practice in Aventura Florida limited to Aesthetic, Implant, and Complex Restorative Dentistry. Dr. Morr received his DMD degree from Tufts University School of Dental Medicine.
